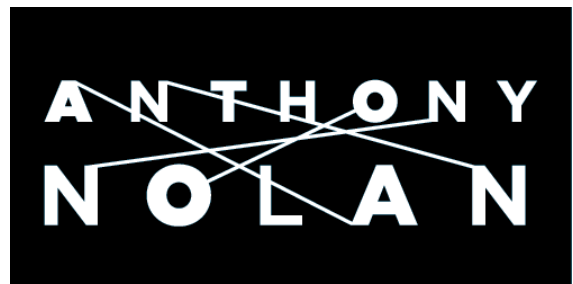
Who do we support?
